

2. 2 Lady Macbeth and Macbeth meet after the murder

Audience

Will they see him kill the king? They thought this last time, will they be robbed of this? **How** will Macbeth kill the king? Will he do ass his wife instructed

Will he be caught?

Who else is awake during this time of night?

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Setting

Location: it appears to be in the same location as the previous scene outside. **Conditions:** The Macbeths talk about the sounds of the animals. Is this in their heads **Time:** His *drink is ready* (2.1 31:32) as Lady Macbeth has rung the bell for bed time

Space: is the space private because they have act secretly or is it private because everyone is on bed?

Character

Status: Lady Macbeth, Macbeth

See: Lady Macbeth sees her husband with bloody hands holding a pair of daggers, Macbeth sees his wife with clean hands and clean clothes

Envy: Lady Macbeth envies the fact that Macbeth was able to do the deed – she wanted to do it but Duncan reminded her of her father. Macbeth envies her clarity of thought and pragmatism.

Predicament: Lady Macbeth wants him to shut up but she has to calm him down. Macbeth wants to bring Duncan back to life but he has to think about his death

Stakes: Lady Macbeth -control, Macbeth balance, order, quiet, peace a time before he did this

Identity/unidentity: Lady Macbeth assertive leader/ frightened daughter Macbeth – terrified boy/strong

Thane

Language

Pre-scene: lady Macbeth putting poison in the drinks, Macbeth killing Duncan

Under poem: *sleep* and *Amen* appears 3 times in the scene, along with prayers, hands, blood, child hood **Pronoun:** *I, me, my* is mentioned many times *he* is only referred to three times in the scene referring to Duncan (13,14,56) If he do bleed. They can't bring themselves to talk about it.

lambic: They cut each other's lines off, finish each other sentences (15:20) are they speaking as one or as

new character, recalibrating their new identifies **Hear:** the storm of language, words, symbols

Impact

See: a husband and wife working out what to do next, there is no going back

Remind: they have committed regicide, this is treason and the price for this death. Gun powder plotters

Think: about the witches' prophesy at the beginning of the play

Feel: shocked about how each of them has reacted -

React: Is he behaving like a King? Is she behaving like a Queen?
