

# Act 5.7 Macbeth fights Young Siward. Siward is killed

## Audience

When are we going to see the death of Macbeth?Who will kill him?How will he be killed?Where will he be killed?

## Situation

Location: The first part happens in the castle, the second and third parts happen outside the castle.
Conditions: Macbeth has hired mercenaries to fight for him (wretched kerns – 18) and Siward report that the castle has 'gently rendered' and is ready to be taken.
Time - There appears to be no jump in time from the last scene
Space: Macbeth's space and then the conquered space outside the castle

## Character

See: Macbeth sees the audience staring at him. Then he sees a young in armour come to fight him
Envy: Macbeth envies the audience for being able to leave the story
Predicament: Macbeth wants to avoid the man not born of woman but he has to fight everyone
Stakes: Macbeth needs to gain his life, Siward needs to gain paternal approval/glory
Identity/unidentity: Macbeth - desperate soldier to assertive warrior on the death of Young Siward

## Language

Pre-scene: Why is Macbeth on his own at the beginning of the scene? Who else has he been talking to?
Under poem: woman/scorn/born – how does this reflect Macbeth's relation to women
Pronoun My name's Macbeth. Macbeth names himself. This is the title of the play. Does this have any significance at the end of the play?

**lambic** – *I am to fear, or none* (4) Think about why this line has only three feet before Young Siward enters. **Hear:** His penultimate conversation with audience appears to be split between the character and the actor.

## Impact

See: A king alludes to himself as a bearRemind: the audience of the bear baiting outside the theatreThink: how tyranny makes animals of us allFeel: thrilled, saddened and thankful that the king is about to dieReact: When is he going to be killed?
